Matthew 28:16-20

Then the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. ¹⁷ When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. ¹⁸ Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

If as a follower of Jesus you are not tangibly and systematically entering into Christ' great commission then you are choosing to live a greater omission.

MAKE: What are you making?

Vs. 19 *Therefore GO and make disciples of all nations.*

 - **An overwhelming task fueled by divine power and love.**
 - **Acts 1:8** *But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.*

MAKE: What are you making?

Vs. 19 *Therefore go and MAKE disciples of all nations.*
